- a) A plan of the grounds. The read line encircles the part actually available for development. The rest, about half of it is occupied by a Golf Course that will eventually go out, and by a quarry that will also return to the Garden and furnish splendid opportunities for rockeries.
- b) A plan very provisional for beautifying the ground about the building. You will note that there is a pavend street: Ave. Desjarding running into the Garden, and which the architect has made use of. You will note also that no provision has been made for an enclosure. Of course this

will have to be supplied.

Exitty early with some terracing, this could be done

without engaging the future too much. For the sake

of public opinion, we will have to do something this

fall, of course.

In the large plan, are indicated the location of existing trees (elms, red maples, <u>Tilia</u>, ) and the elevations above sea level. The whole is on a terrace of the St. Lawrence River, gently sloping to the south.
